It stands as a symbol of culture, intellect, and compassion – a place where art, literature, and tradition still thrive in harmony with modern life.

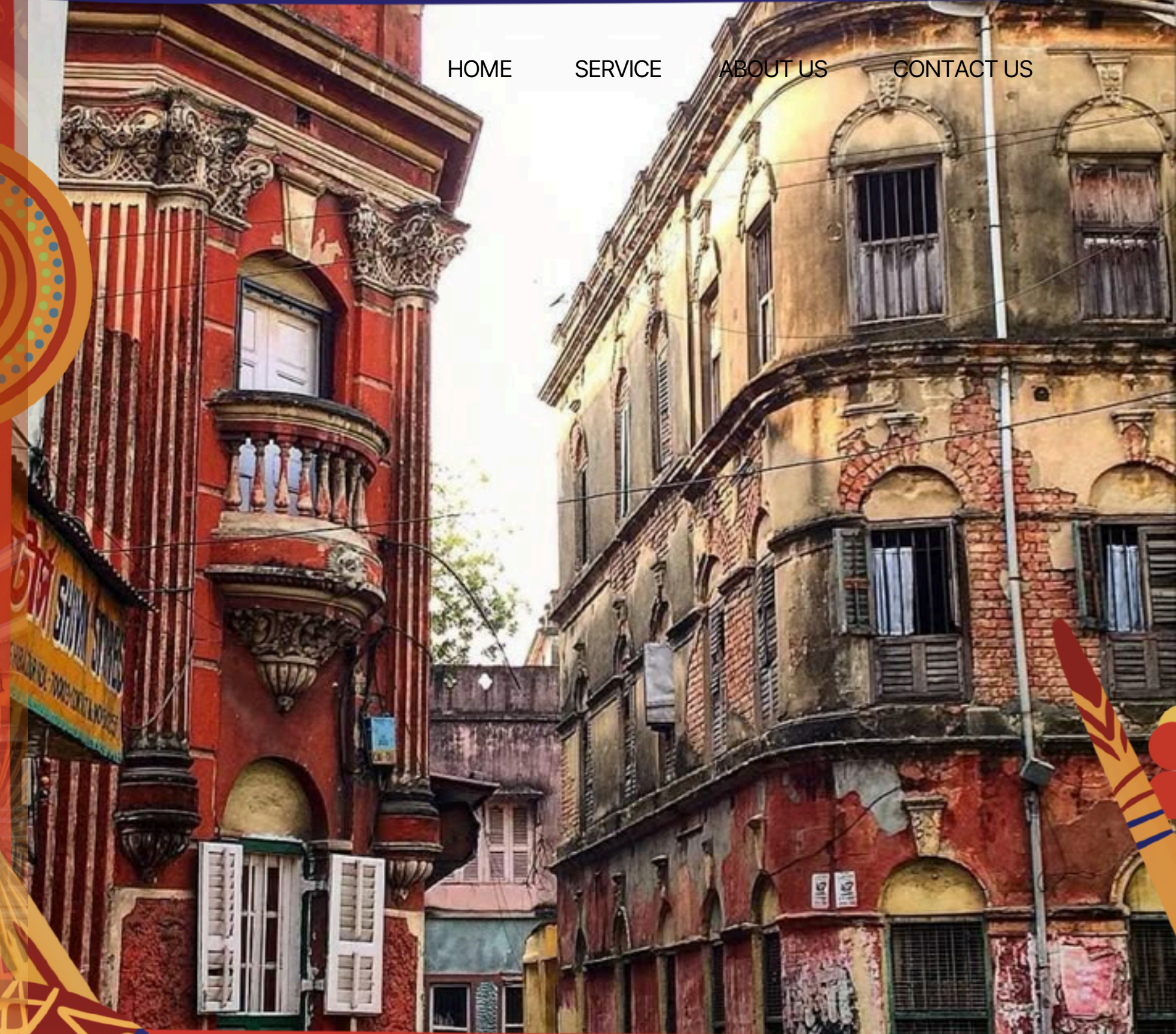

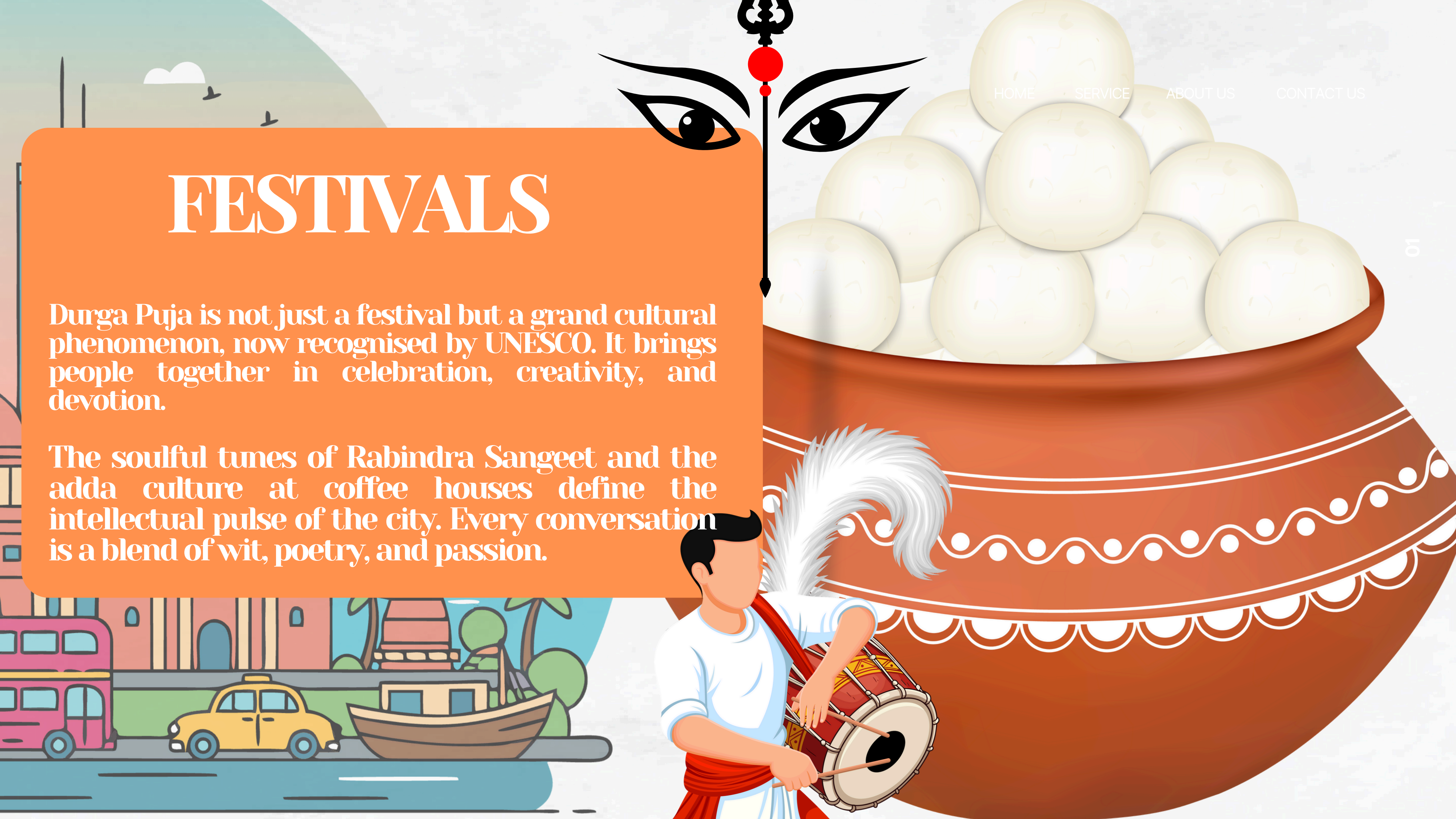
Kolkata has always been a creative hub, from the stages of Nandan and Academy of Fine Arts to street theatre movements. Art here is not elite, it belongs to everyone.
